


Encouraging children to understand why reading is so important, but also to provide them with variety of text types are key elements to developing and enriching their reading experiences.

Read to your Child:

Hearing your child read is a critical part in their reading development. At any age our language and imagination can be enriched through hearing a story. It really supports reading and writing skills and can help to motivate children. Therefore, I strongly encourage you to take the time to snuggle up and spend some quality time enjoying a book together. From this quality reading time, a shared love of books can be developed. Have fun putting silly voices on for different characters or joining in together for familiar parts of the story.



Questions:

Spending time talking about the pictures and what is happening in the story, Here are some example of questions you might like to ask:

- What is the story about?
- Did anything make you laugh or smile?
- What has happened so far?
- What do you think will happen next?
- Can you tell me what happens at the beginning, in the middle or at the end of the story?
- Why do you like/not like this book?
- Who are the main characters?
- Can you describe the characters?
- Which character would you like to be? Why?
- What is your favourite bit of the story? Show me the page.
- Does this book remind you of other stories, or TV programmes/DVDs?
- Does this story remind you of anything that has happened to you?
